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The MetabolitePilot™ 2.0.3 software is a processing only software, used for the identification and characterization of metabolites.

The software processes accurate-mass data, acquired from:

- The SCIEX TripleTOF® series of instruments, using the Analyst® TF software, version 1.5 or higher.
- The SCIEX X500 QTOF series of instruments, using SCIEX OS, versions 1.2, 1.3, and 1.3.1.

Related Documentation

The online Help for the MetabolitePilot™ software is installed automatically with the software and is available from the Start menu: **All Programs > SCIEX > MetabolitePilot**.

To access the online Help from within the MetabolitePilot™ software, users can press **F1** or click **Help** in the Menu bar.

Workflow-specific procedures are available through the **How Do I?** button in the upper-right corner of the workspace. When **How Do I?** is clicked, users can select the appropriate Help topic from the list provided.

Changes from Version 2.0.2 to Version 2.0.3

Support for Data Acquired using the SCIEX X500 QTOF Series of Instruments

- This release of the MetabolitePilot™ software processes data acquired using the SCIEX X500 QTOF series of instruments and version 1.2, 1.3, and 1.3.1 of SCIEX OS.

Results Workspace

- The Potential Metabolites table in the Results workspace and the Analog Integration window will be sorted by Peak ID in ascending order when the results file is opened for the first time.

Issues Fixed in the MetabolitePilot™ 2.0.3 Software

The following issues have been fixed in the 2.0.3 version of the MetabolitePilot™ software.

- The tabulated data in the Analog Integration window was not arranged correctly when sorted by Peak ID. This issue has been fixed. (MP-1756)
- In the Processing Parameters pane, the numerical count of selected rows for tabulated data in the Catabolites, Cleavage Metabolites and Mass Defect tab was not refreshed. Now, the number is refreshed when the individual check boxes are either selected or cleared. (MP-1423)
- Analog Integration: Overlaid XICs did not work when either Baseline Subtract or RT Offset was applied or both were applied. This issue has been fixed. (MP-888)
- Previously, the auto-generated structure could not be copied. The user is now able to copy the auto-generated structure by right-clicking on the structure pane and then clicking Copy Structure. (MP-2079)

Workstation Requirements

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The workstation must be configured with the following applications:

- English version of the 64-bit Microsoft Windows 7 operating system, with SP1
- Microsoft Office 2010 or 2013 (64-bit) or 2016 (64-bit)

Note: If a trial version of Microsoft Office is installed on the computer, then the full version of the Microsoft Office software must be activated before the trial period expires. The license can be purchased from your regional division of Microsoft or from an authorized distributor in your region.

Computer Requirements

Dell OptiPlex XE2 computer, with:

- An Intel Core I5-4570S processor (Quad core, 2.90 GHz, 6 MB with HD Graphics 4600)
- 32 GB DDR3 1600 Mhz SDRAM
- 2*2 TB HDD (RAID1)
- DVD+-RW

Note: Newer systems might become available. For more information, contact the local sales representative. Older computer models might be compatible. However, they have not been tested and might result in degraded performance.

Notes on Installation

- The MetabolitePilot™ 2.0.3 software is a new installation only. Upgrades from existing versions of the software are not supported. If version 2.0 or 2.0.2 of the MetabolitePilot™ software is installed, then it must be removed before version 2.0.3 can be installed. Refer to [Remove the MetabolitePilot™ Software on page 18](#). However, other versions of the MetabolitePilot™ software (1.0 and 1.5) can exist on the same computer.
- If version 2.0 or 2.0.2 of the MetabolitePilot™ software was installed on the computer, then during installation of version 2.0.3, the following components are overwritten with updated versions:
 - Biotransformations database
 - Report templates

Custom biotransformation added to the Biotransformation database from version 2.0 or 2.0.2 must be added to the Biotransformation database installed by version 2.0.3.

If the user has created custom processing parameters using the original Biotransformations database from version 2.0 or 2.0.2, then the user must click the **Select Set** button on the **Biotransformations** tab of the Generic Parameters after version 2.0.3 of the software has been installed to use the information from the updated database. This will make sure that all viable proposed structures are included in the interpretation results.

- The user must be logged on to the computer as a user with Administrator privileges.
- The User Account Control settings must be set to **Never notify**. Refer to [Change the User Account Control \(UAC\) Settings on page 19](#).
- When a zip file that contains the MetabolitePilot™ software installer is being used, then extract all of the files from the zip file before running the installer from the location containing the extracted files. Errors will occur if the installer is run from within the zip file.
- If a DVD is used for the installation, then we recommend that customers copy all of the DVD contents to a local drive for storage. To prevent potential issues with installing the software, for example, if a repair is necessary, this locally-stored version must be used.

- The installer installs the following software if it is not already installed on the system:
 - .NET Framework 3.5 with SP1, if required
 - .NET Framework 4.5.1, if required
 - Microsoft Visual C++ 2010 Redistributable Package (x64)
 - Microsoft Visual C++ 2010 Redistributable Package (x86)
 - Microsoft Visual C++ 2013 Redistributable Package (x64)
 - Microsoft Visual Studio 2010 Tools for Office Runtime (x64)
 - AB SCIEX Reporter Template Suite 3.2
 - Microsoft Save as PDF Add-in for 2007 Microsoft Office programs
 - Microsoft Office 2010 Primary Interop Assemblies

Install the MetabolitePilot™ Software

1. Read these release notes.
2. Log on to the computer as a Microsoft Windows user with administrator privileges.
3. Make sure that all of the applications are closed.

Note: If the MetabolitePilot™ 2.0 or 2.0.2 software was installed, then remove the software before installing version 2.0.3.

4. Install the MetabolitePilot™ software as described in [Table 3-1](#).

5. Click **Next**.

The End-User License Agreement dialog opens.

6. Click **I Agree**.

The Destination Folder dialog opens.

Tip! The user can change the location of the software installation and the data folders before clicking **Next**.

7. Click **Next**.

The Ready to Install the Program dialog opens.

8. Click **Install**.

The Installing MetabolitePilot 2.0.3 dialog opens.

9. After the installation is complete, click **Finish**.

10. If a DVD was used to complete the installation, then back up the contents of the installation DVD to a local drive.

Note: The locally-stored installation files should be used if the software needs to be repaired.

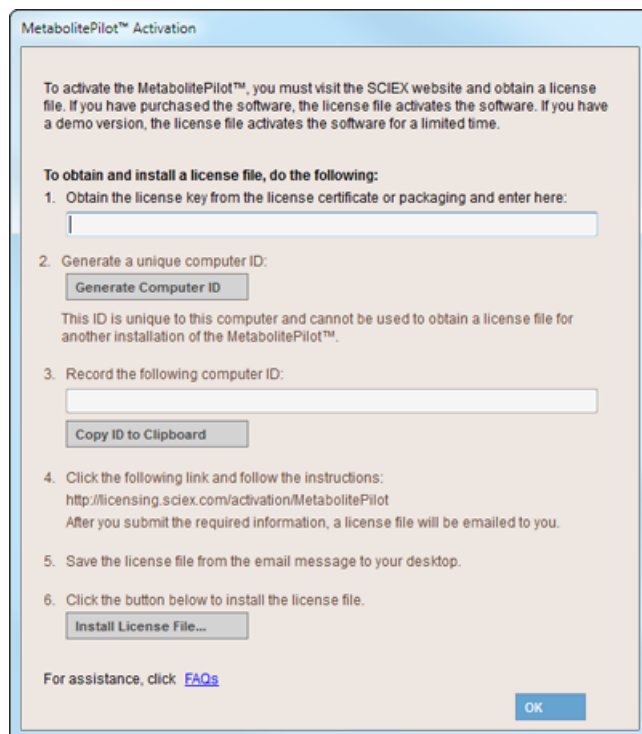
Note: If the MetabolitePilot™ 2.0 or 2.0.2 software was installed and licensed, then a new license file is not required. Version 2.0.3 can be used with the version 2.0 license file.

Activation

Note: Internet access is required to obtain a license for the software. If the computer where the MetabolitePilot™ software is being installed does not have Internet access, then make a copy of the generated computer ID. On a computer with Internet access, go to <http://licensing.sciex.com/activation/MetabolitePilot> and then follow the instructions to obtain a license.

1. Double-click the MetabolitePilot™ software desktop icon.

The MetabolitePilot™ Activation dialog opens.

2. Type the license key from the license certificate (found in the MetabolitePilot™ software installation package) in the appropriate field.

Note: If the licence key is stored on the computer, then copy and paste the key in the field. If a license key is not available, then contact sciex.com/request-support.

3. Click **Generate Computer ID**.

This creates a unique identifier for the workstation.

4. Click **Copy ID to Clipboard**.
5. Click the <http://licensing.sciex.com/activation/MetabolitePilot> link.
6. Follow the instructions to obtain the license.

Note: SCIEXNow login credentials are required to obtain the license key.

After the required information is submitted, a license file is sent to all of the e-mail addresses provided.

Installation

7. Close the browser window.
8. When the e-mail containing the license file is received, copy the license file to the workstation desktop.
9. In the MetabolitePilot™ Activation dialog, click **Install License File**.
10. In the Select the new license file to be installed dialog, browse to and then select the license file.
11. Click **Open**.

Both the Select the new license file to be installed and the MetabolitePilot™ Activation dialogs close, and the MetabolitePilot™ software opens.

Note: If a temporary license is being used, do not make any changes to the computer clock. Changes can void the temporary licence and a new license file will be required.

Known Issues and Limitations

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Everyone should read this section of the Release Notes.

Note: The numbers in brackets are reference numbers to each issue or feature in our internal tracking system.

Microsoft Windows 7 Operating System

- The Microsoft Windows 7 operating system might hide the C:\ProgramData folder. After installing the MetabolitePilot™ 2.0.3 software, make sure that all users can view the C:\ProgramData\SCIEX\MetabolitePilotData 2.0 folder. If the folder is not visible, then:
 1. In Windows Explorer, click **Organize > Folder and search options**. The Folder Options dialog opens.
 2. Select the **View** tab.
 3. Click **Hidden files and folder > Show hidden files, folders, or drives**.
 4. Click **Apply**.
 5. Click **OK**.

SWATH® Acquisition MS/MS Reference Spectra

- When extracting reference spectra from SWATH® acquisition data, an extensive list of MS/MS spectral data is proposed. Users should be aware that some of the precursors associated with the proposed MS/MS spectral data could have a low TOF MS peak intensity or low chromatographic peak intensity. (MP-1854)

Metabolite Name and Score

- For each metabolite, a list of possible MS identities is shown in the Name field of the Edit Name and Formula dialog. For ADC results, the MS identities resulting from one or more antibody fragments with identical masses are not included in the list of other proposed names and, therefore, are not conveniently accessible to the user in the Interpretation view. (MP-1745)
- The isotope pattern score and the MS isotope pattern highlight (orange) provide non-complementary information. (MP-1792)
 - The isotope pattern score shows the similarity between the experimental MS peaks and the isotope pattern of the formula and adduct assigned to the metabolite. In the absence of an assigned formula, the isotope pattern score shows the similarity between the experimental MS peaks and the isotope pattern of the reference compound formula using the adduct assigned to the metabolite.
 - The isotope pattern highlight on the MS panel shows the similarity of the isotope pattern to the reference compound using the primary ion type selected in the processing parameters.

Known Issues and Limitations

- The isotope pattern score shown on the Details pane for a metabolite can vary for the same metabolite (with identical XIC and MS peaks), depending on the peak finding strategy used to process the data. (MP-1832)
 - For metabolites found by the Predicted Metabolite peak finding strategy, the isotope pattern score shows the similarity between the experimental MS peaks and the isotope pattern of the formula and adduct assigned to the metabolite.
 - For metabolites found by a peak finding strategy other than the Predicted Metabolite peak finding strategy, the isotope patterns score shows the similarity between the experimental MS peaks and the isotope pattern of the reference compound formula, using the adduct assigned to the metabolite.
- For the same wiff file, there might be a variation in the MS/MS Similarity score in the Details pane of the Results workspace, depending on the Source of Reference MS/MS Spectrum selected (Sample or Selected reference spectrum) in the MS/MS Parameters of the Generic processing parameters. (MP-1839)

Structure and Sequence Assignment

- For small molecule results, the structures and ranking proposed by the software through the Generate option have not been validated for metabolites assigned with multiple biotransformations. (MP-1938)
- For large, complex peptide data, the time required by the software to propose potential sequence candidates through the Generate option and the time required to review the MS/MS ion annotation for the proposed candidate is extensive. (MP-1692, MP-1712)

Interpretation

- Because of the restrictive representation of the sequence for cyclopeptide, the interpretation of the MS/MS spectrum only assigns a subset of the fragmentation ions. (MP-923)
- For peptide and Antibody Drug Conjugates (ADC) results, some of the MS/MS peaks that are successfully assigned, as shown in the Fragments tables, are incorrectly identified as x or are missing the ✓ in the peak label on the MS/MS spectrum. The ✓ on the MS/MS spectrum indicates that the peak has been assigned a formula. (MP-1559, MP-1771)
- The ion names for the MS/MS peaks assigned as ion fragments arising from three or more broken bonds on a multi-chain sequence are incomplete and show only a portion of the actual a- or b- type cleavages involved in generating the fragments. (MP-1777)
- For ADC results, the Load Sequence option populates the protein fragment sequence associated with the name assigned during data processing even if the name of the metabolite has been modified using the Edit Name and Formula option. As a workaround, the sequence of interest can be typed in the Metabolite Sequence pane. (MP-1957)

Peak Finding Strategies

- When more than one peak finding strategy is used to process a data file, the chromatograms associated with specific peak finding strategies might not be shown for some of the metabolites in the Results file. To make sure that all of the appropriate chromatograms are shown, increase the **Maximum number of unexpected metabolites** on the **MS Parameters** tab of the Generic Parameters. (MP-2011)

Amino Acid Modifications

- Amino acid modifications that are present in assigned metabolite sequences and in sequences in the Fragments table are enclosed in square brackets in the software user interface. However, when an interpretation report is generated for peptide and ADC results, the square brackets are not always included in the printed report. (MP-2031)

Remove the MetabolitePilot™ Software

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1. Log on to the computer as a Microsoft Windows user with Administrator privileges.
2. Click **Start > Control Panel > Programs and Features**.

Tip! If the control panel components are shown by **Category**, then click **Start > Control Panel > Programs > Programs and Features > Uninstall a program**.

3. Select the MetabolitePilot™ software and then click **Uninstall**.

The software is removed, with no user intervention required.

During the removal, the software name is removed from the Installed Programs list, the shortcut to the MetabolitePilot™ software is removed from the desktop, and the shortcuts to the software and the user documentation are removed from the Start menu.

The following components remain on the computer:

- The C:\ProgramData\SCIEX\MetabolitePilotData 2.0 folder, which contains MetabolitePilot™ software project data.
- The C:\ProgramData\SCIEX\ElementalCalculator folder, which contains any custom residues and modifications.
- If the product is licensed, then the C:\Program Files\SCIEX\MetabolitePilot 2.0 folder, which contains the license file, remains on the computer.
- AB SCIEX Reporter Template Suite 3.2
- Microsoft .NET Framework, versions 3.5 and 4.5.1, if installed
- Microsoft Visual C++ 2010 Redistributable Package (x64)
- Microsoft Visual C++ 2010 Redistributable Package (x86)
- Microsoft Visual C++ 2013 Redistributable Package (x64)
- Microsoft Visual Studio 2010 Tools for Office Runtime (x64)
- Microsoft Save as PDF Add-in for 2007 Microsoft Office programs

Change the User Account Control (UAC) Settings

1. Click **Start > Control Panel**.
2. Click **User Accounts > Change User Account Control settings**.

The User Account Control Settings dialog opens.

3. Move the slide bar to the **Never notify** setting and then click **OK**.
